
Memories are created at the NJSIAA state finals.

For the first time ever, a father and a daughter officiated a state championship contest.




Ben Tanglao looks on as the R1 in the NJSIAA Non-Public A finals on Nov. 12, 2023. John Jones

IHA and Paul VI have met each other three times in a row in the NPA championship and featured every showdown resulting in a three-set affair. That calls for a tremendous amount of pressure for the officials, who were well-aware of the magnitude of the game - and the rivalry unveiling in front of them.

This father-daughter tandem did not waiver. Their love and trust for one another only calmed them down to prevent the moment from growing too large.

"Sarah did a great job today. There is nothing I could say badly about her... in all facets of life. But she is an excellent referee who always works hard and strives to be fair. All of that showed today," Ben Tanglao said.


His smile before praising Sarah said it all.
